Overview of the Court's statistics in 2024

The Court's statistics for 2024 disclose a decrease in the number of incoming applications allocated to a judicial formation and an increase in the number of applications decided by means of a judgment.

A. New applications

In 2024, 28,800 applications were allocated to a judicial formation, an overall decrease of 17% compared with 2023 (34,650). This can be explained principally by a decrease in the number of allocated applications against Türkiye, Hungary, Belgium, Slovenia and Serbia. Of the total allocated, 19,700 applications were identified as single-judge cases likely to be declared inadmissible (a decrease of 6% in relation to 2023). As in previous years, single-judge applications continued to be processed as soon as they were identified as qualifying for such a procedure. In addition, 9,100 applications were identified as probable Chamber or Committee cases (a decrease of 33% compared with 2023).

B. Applications disposed of judicially and pending applications

In total, 36,819 applications were disposed of judicially, a decrease of 4% in relation to 2023 (38,260). The number of applications disposed of exceeded the number of allocated applications by slightly more than 8,000. As a result, the number of allocated applications pending before the Court decreased over the year, from 68,450 to 60,350.

C. Processing of applications

1. Pre-allocation

As at 31 December 2024, the number of applications pending at the pre-judicial stage stood at 4,300, an increase of 8% as compared with the same date of the previous year (4,000). The number of applications disposed of administratively in 2024 was 8,650, a decrease of 18%. Of those files, 77% were disposed of for failure to comply with the requirements of Rule 47 of the Rules of Court (contents of an individual application). The remainder of those files were disposed of administratively because applicants had not submitted an application form within the time-limit set by the Registry.

2. Inadmissibility or striking-out decisions

In 2024, 25,990 applications were declared inadmissible or struck out of the list of cases by a single judge, a Committee, a Chamber or the Grand Chamber, a 17% decrease compared with 2023 (31,329).

The single-judge formation decided 22,210 applications in 2024, 14% less than in 2023 (25,834). This can be explained by a decrease in the number of applications allocated to a single judge in 2024.

In 2024, 1,561 applications were struck out by a Chamber or a Committee in a decision following a friendly settlement or a unilateral declaration, a decrease of 36% (2,425 in 2023). Friendly settlements (1,164) decreased by 35% (1,801 in 2023) and unilateral declarations decreased by 36% (397 in 2024 as against 624 in 2023). In addition, 2,219 applications were declared inadmissible by the Grand Chamber, a Chamber or a Committee or struck out by those formations on other grounds (28% less than in 2023).

3. Communicated applications

In 2024, 9,832 applications were communicated (a decrease of 41% compared with 2023, when 16,623 applications were communicated). The decrease was largely due to the fact that fewer applications were communicated against Russia in 2024.

4. Judgments

Judgments were delivered in respect of 10,829 applications (compared with 6,931 in 2023, an increase of 56%). A large proportion of those applications were joined, with the result that the number of judgments actually delivered was 1,102, an increase of 9% compared to 2023. 814 judgments (in respect of

10,241 applications) were adopted by a three-judge Committee formation (19% more than in 2023). Moreover, this represented a 60% increase (10,241 compared with 6,386 in 2023) in the number of applications decided in a judgment by three-judge Committees, which accounted for 95% of applications decided by means of a judgment (compared with 92% in 2023). In 2024 the number of applications decided by means of a judgment reached yet another record figure, if the 2017 *Burmych and Others* judgment is not taken into account (*Burmych and Others v. Ukraine* (striking out) [GC], nos. 46852/13 and 12,147 others, 12 October 2017).

6. Requests for interim measures (Rule 39 of the Rules of Court)

The total number of decisions on interim measures (1,630) decreased by 38% compared with 2023 (2,635). The Court granted requests for interim measures in 371 cases (a decrease of 74% in relation to the total of 1,418 in 2023) and dismissed them in 347 cases (a decrease of 3% compared with 359 in 2023). It should be noted that around 70% of the requests granted concerned issues other than expulsion or extradition. The remainder fell outside the scope of Rule 39 of the Rules of Court.

D. Priority policy¹

The essence of this policy is to concentrate more resources on the most important cases, namely the cases falling within the top three categories (“priority applications”). On 31 December 2024 13,373 applications were pending in these categories (a decrease of 34% from the beginning of the year). This result was mainly achieved thanks to the high productivity in these categories in 2024. Indeed, 9,151 priority applications were disposed of judicially, an increase of 33% compared to 2023 (6,880).

The number of priority applications communicated to the respondent Governments decreased by 70% compared to 2023 (10,114 in 2023 and 3,060 in 2024). The number of priority applications declared inadmissible or struck out of the list of cases by the Grand Chamber, a Chamber or a Committee decreased by 43% (1,805 in 2023 and 1,036 in 2024). The number of priority applications struck out following a friendly settlement or a unilateral declaration decreased from 794 in 2023 to 264 in 2024. The number of priority applications giving rise to a judgment increased by 60% in 2024 (5,075 in 2023 and 8,115 in 2024). Such high figures were made possible by the number of applications processed against Russia. In 2024 almost 5,300 priority applications against Russia ended in a judgment.

E. Conclusion

The Court was able to reduce the number of pending applications, mainly as a result of fewer applications being allocated to a judicial formation and the processing of certain groups of applications, in particular those against Russia. The number of applications declared inadmissible or struck out by Committees decreased by 33% (from 5,344 in 2023 to 3,589 in 2024), but this decrease was principally due to the drop in the number of applications struck out following a friendly settlement or unilateral declaration by a Committee (from 2,421 in 2023 to 1,517 in 2024) and to a large group of applications against Poland being declared inadmissible in 2023.

The impact strategy² is aimed at enhancing the Court’s immediate impact and relevance for the applicants and in the member States and its ability to address core legal issues of relevance for the Convention system as a whole. On 1 January 2021 there were almost 18,000 applications pending in category IV. By 1 January 2025 around 15,450 applications remained pending in category IV, of which 181 have been identified as having an “impact”. Since January 2021, 820 “impact” applications have been processed, with 308 resulting in a judgment (53 in 2024), 80 declared inadmissible or struck out of the list of cases (21 in 2024) and 432 communicated (42 in 2024). The impact strategy further ensured a “balanced and productive” output of non-impact category IV cases. In 2024, there was a 21% increase in the processing of Chamber applications in categories IV and IV-High compared with 2023 (494 applications decided in 2024 against 408 in 2023).

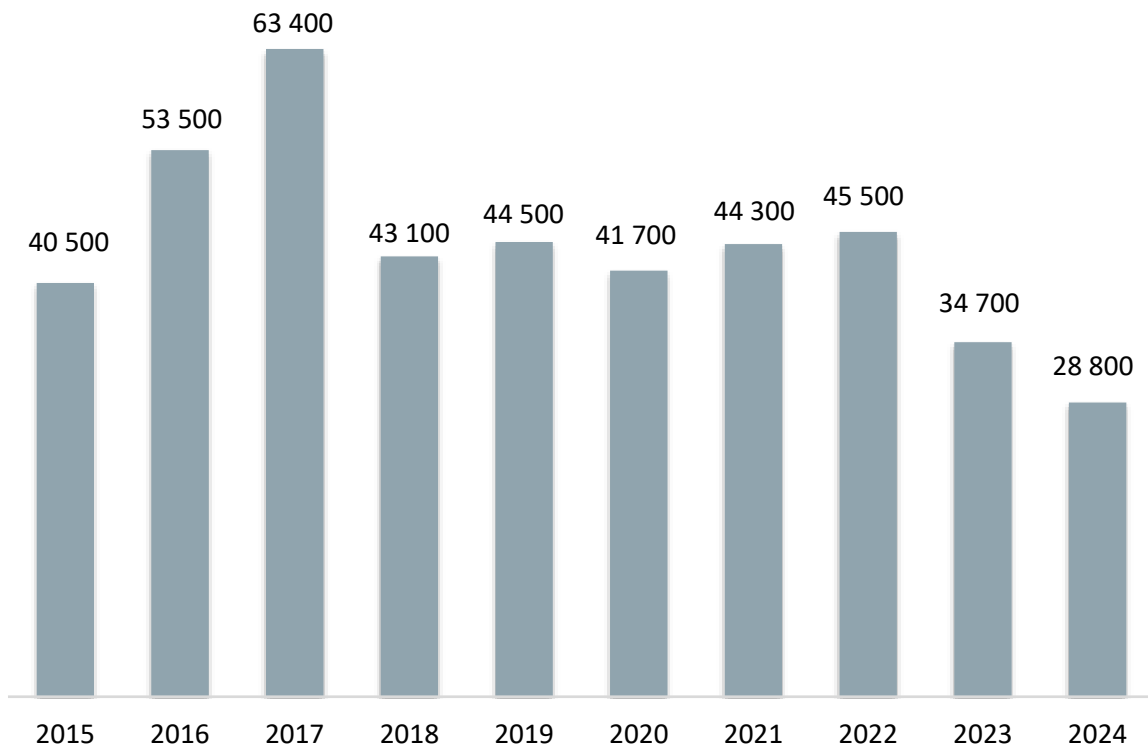
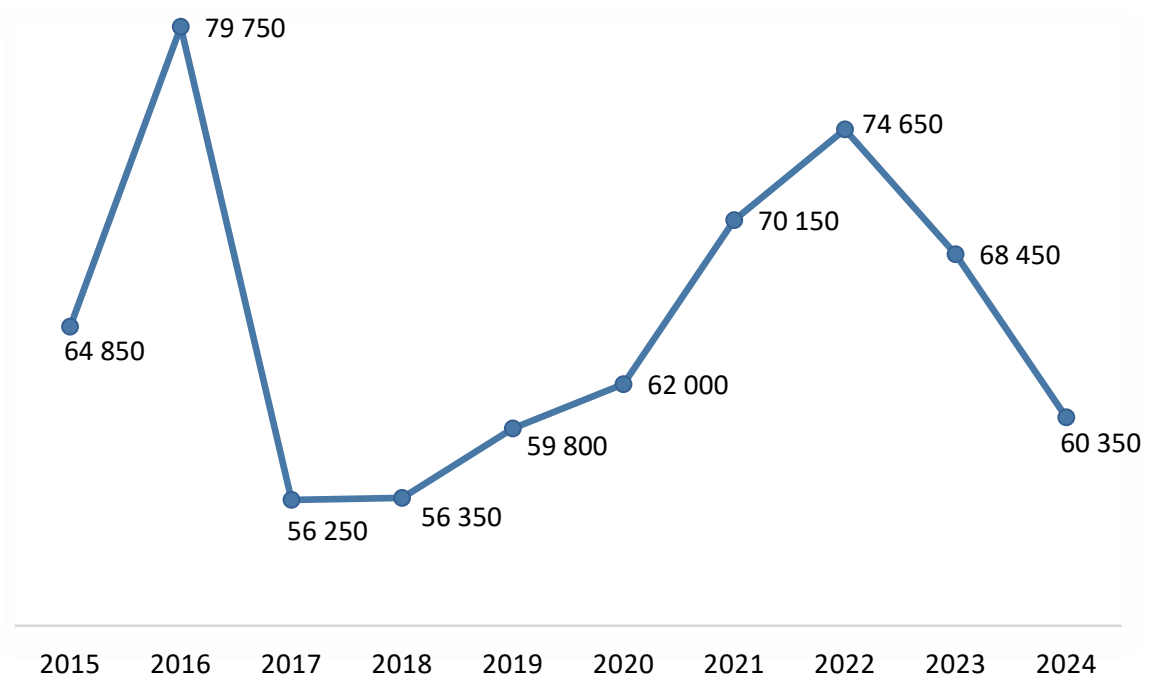

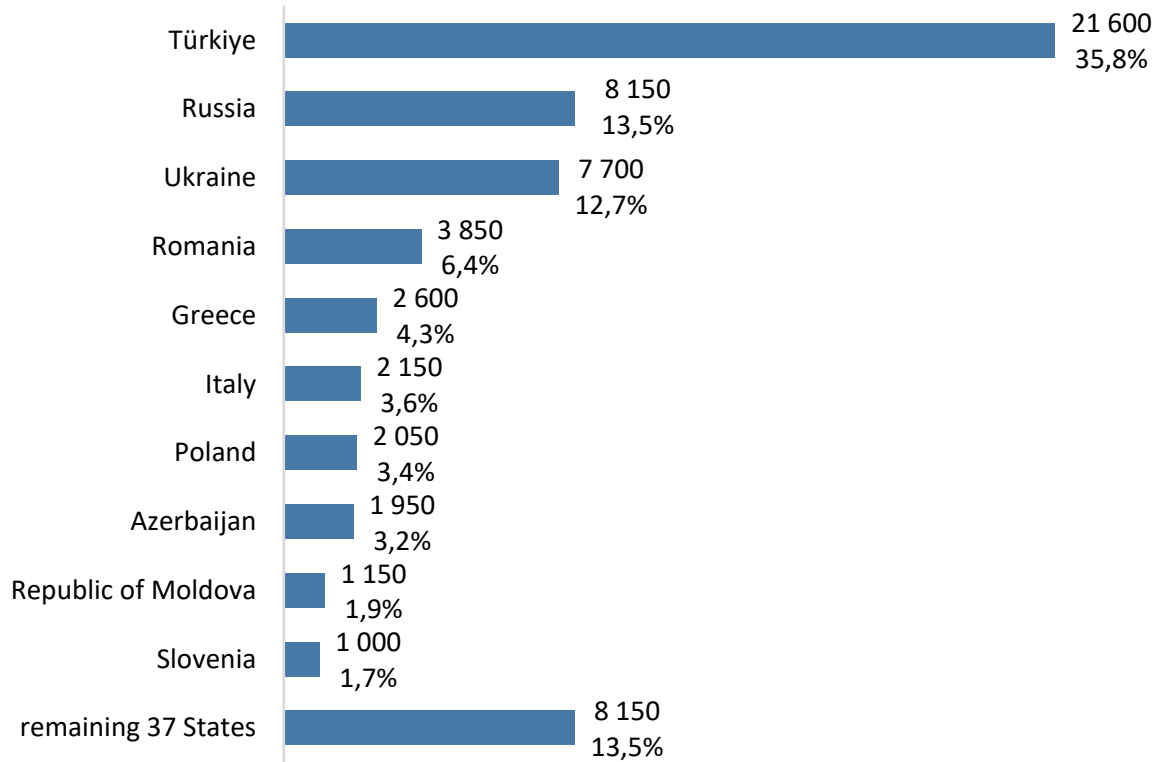
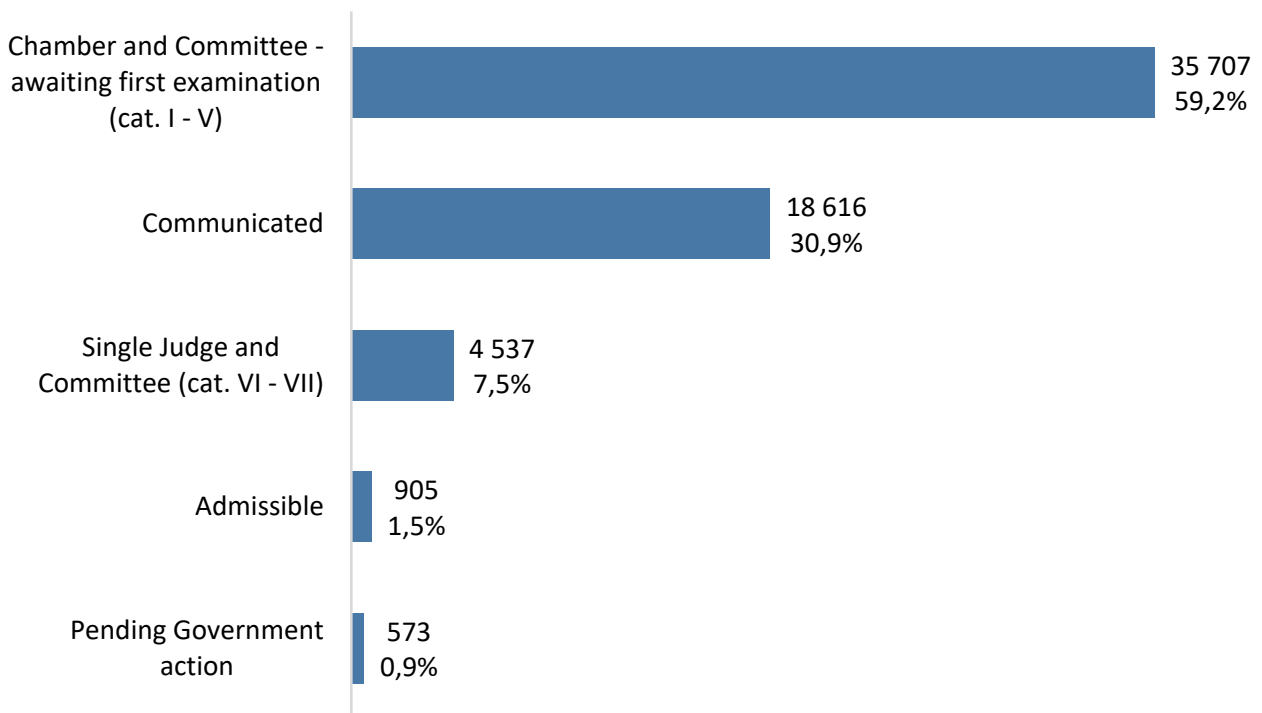

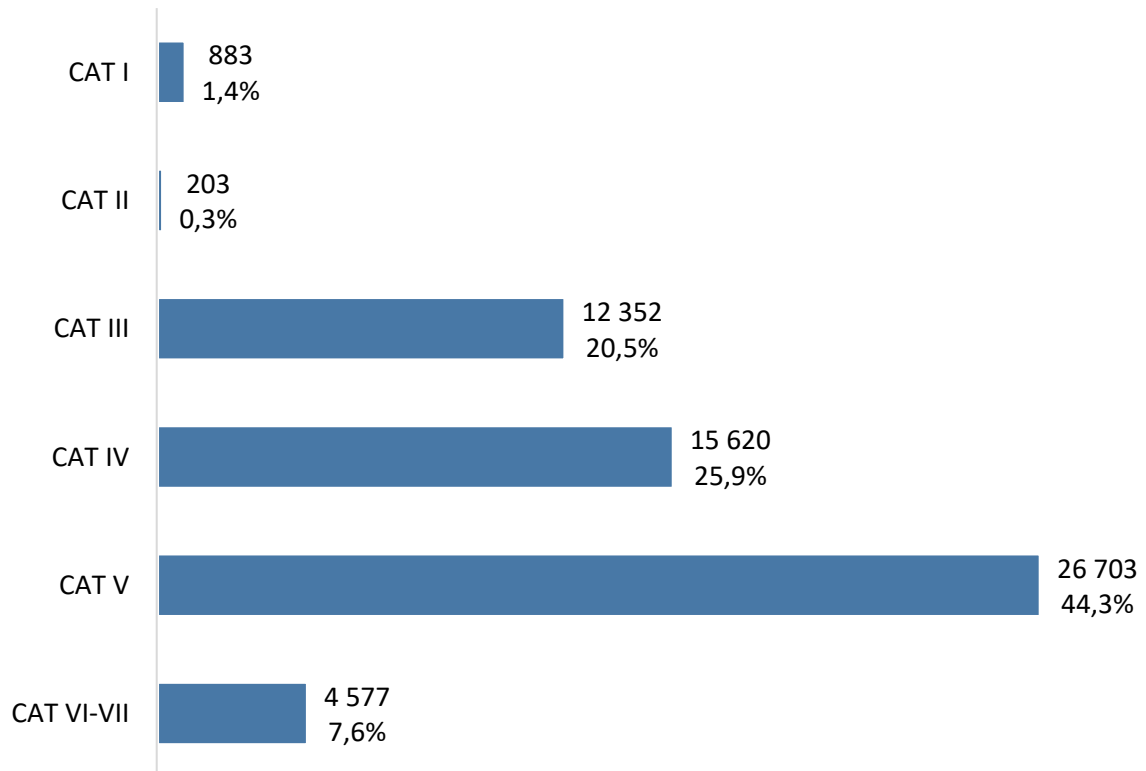
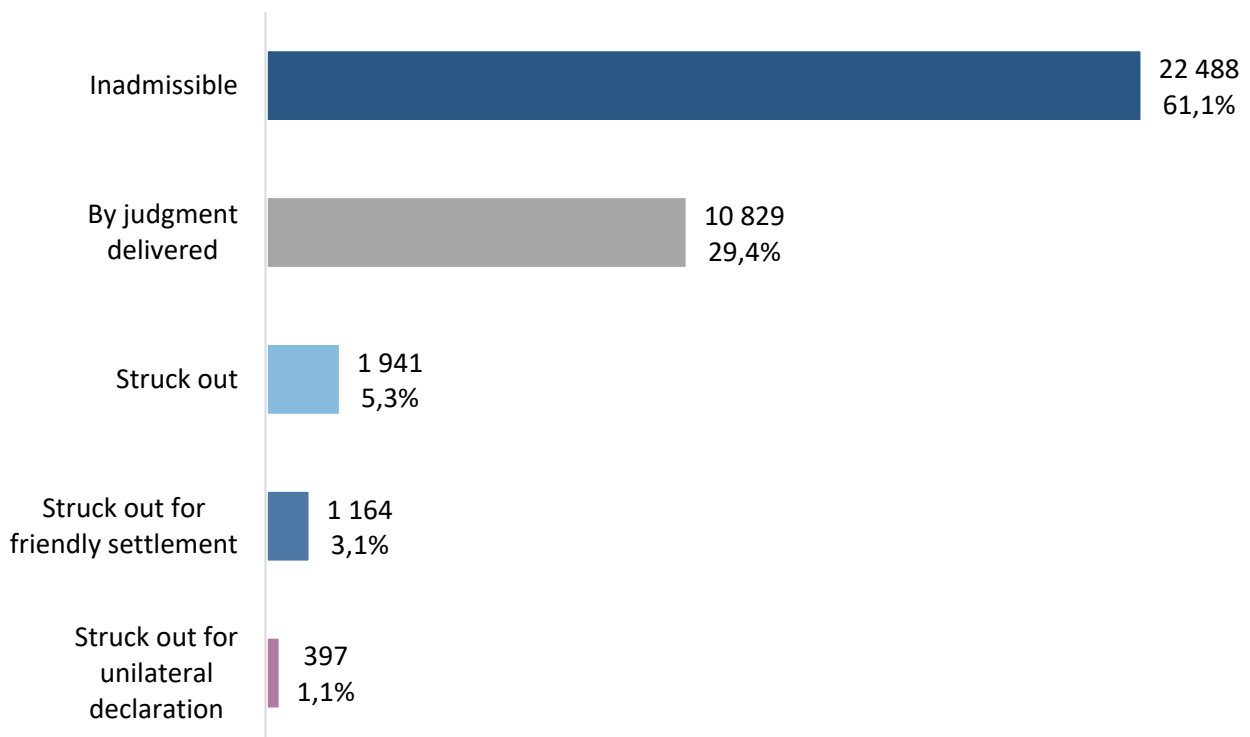
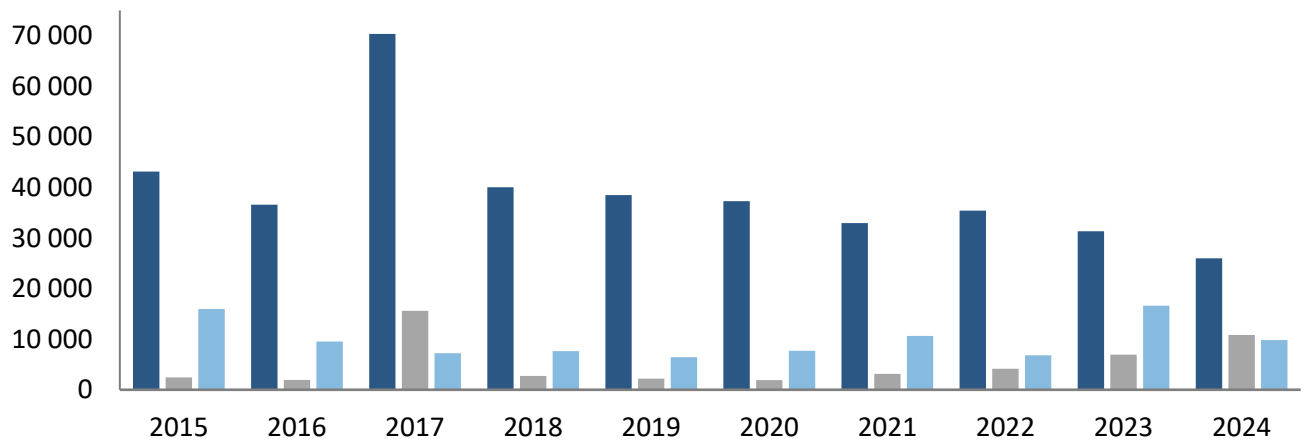
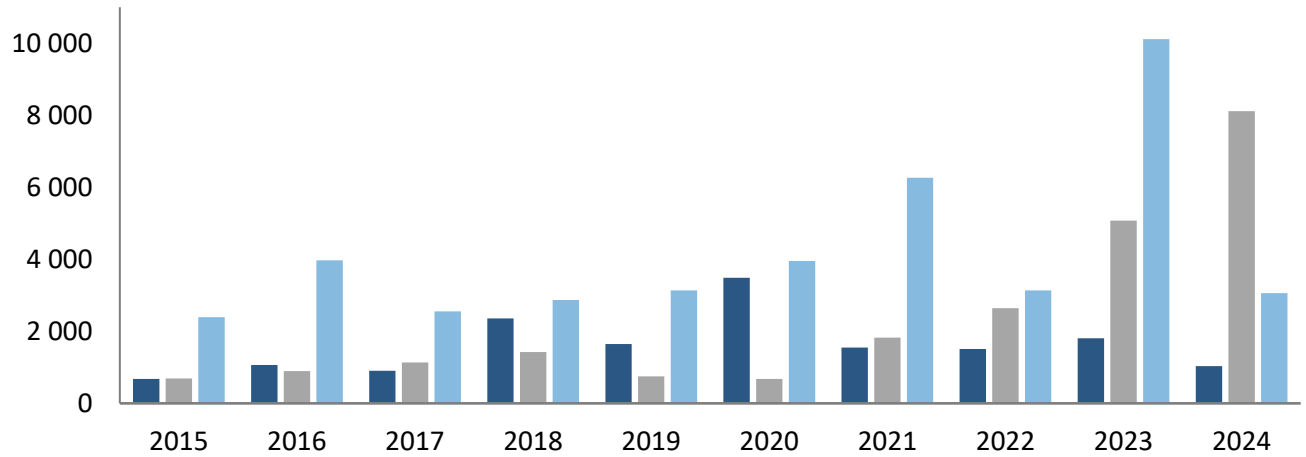
Chart 5 Breakdown of 60,350 pending applications by category**Chart 6 36,819 applications disposed of judicially in 2024**

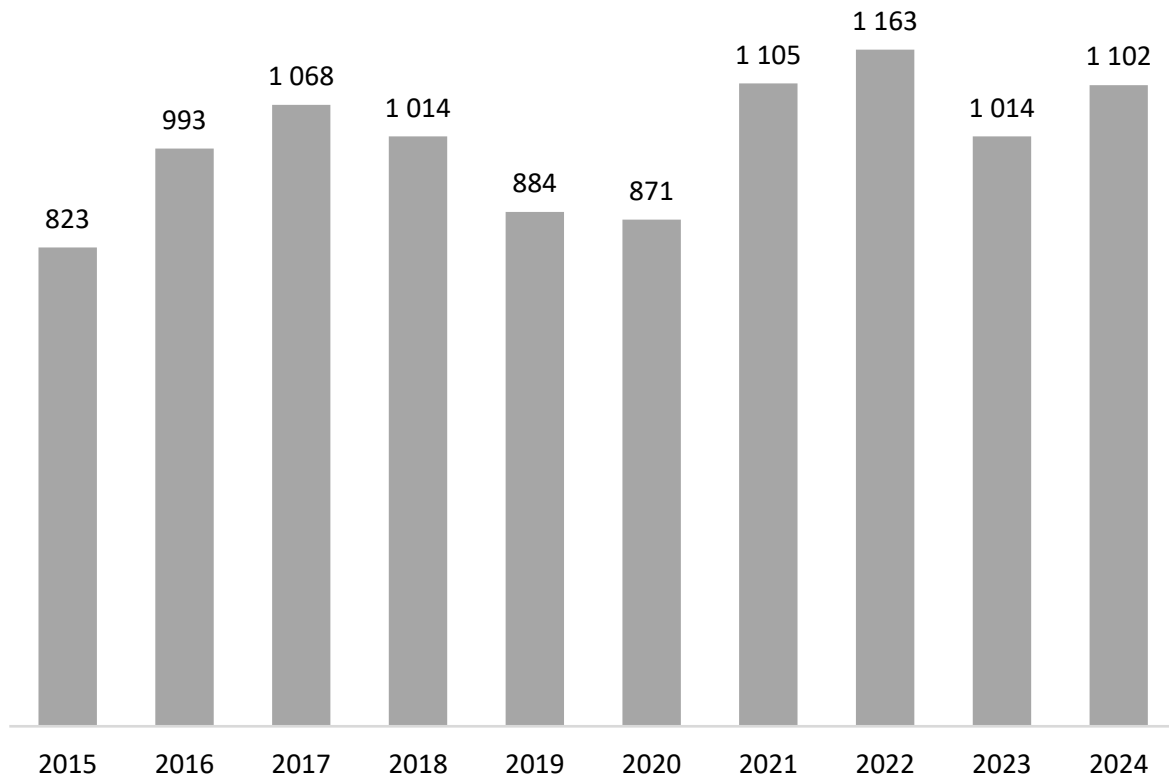
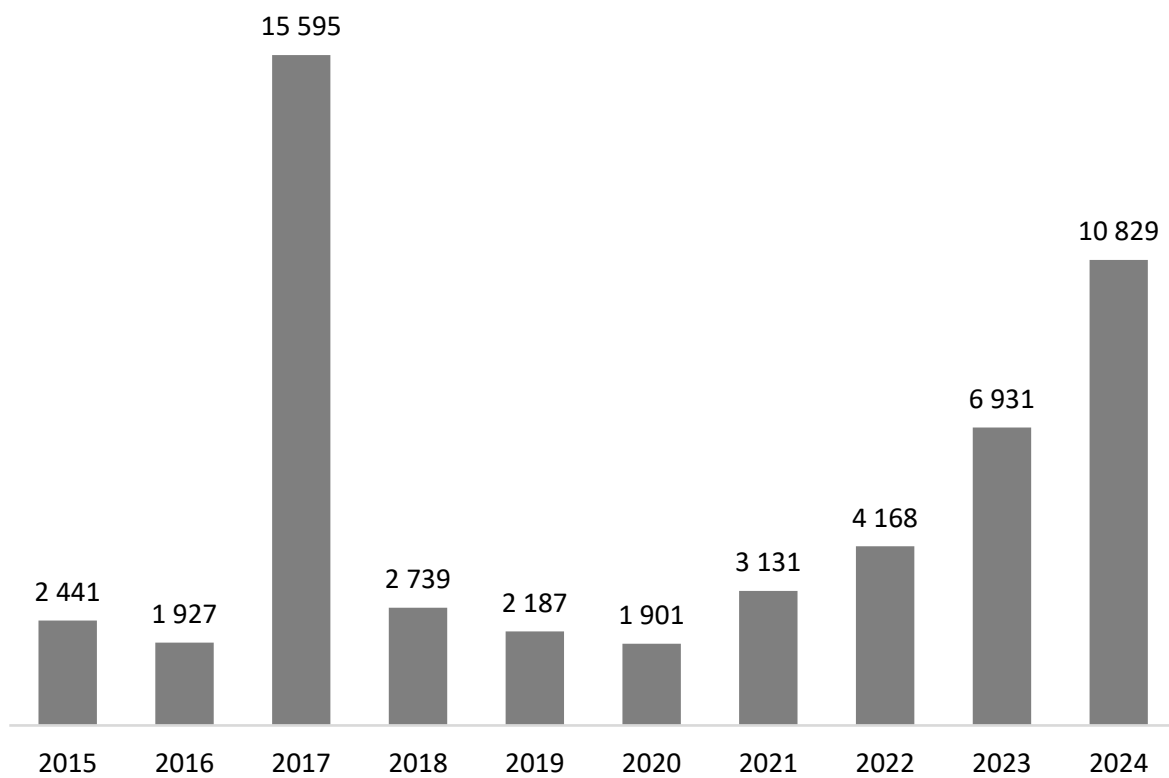
Chart 9 Number of judgments (legal acts) delivered over the past ten years**Chart 10 Number of applications by judgments delivered over the past ten years**

Chart 11 Number of applications declared inadmissible by the Grand Chamber, a Chamber or a Committee or struck out by those formations over the past ten years

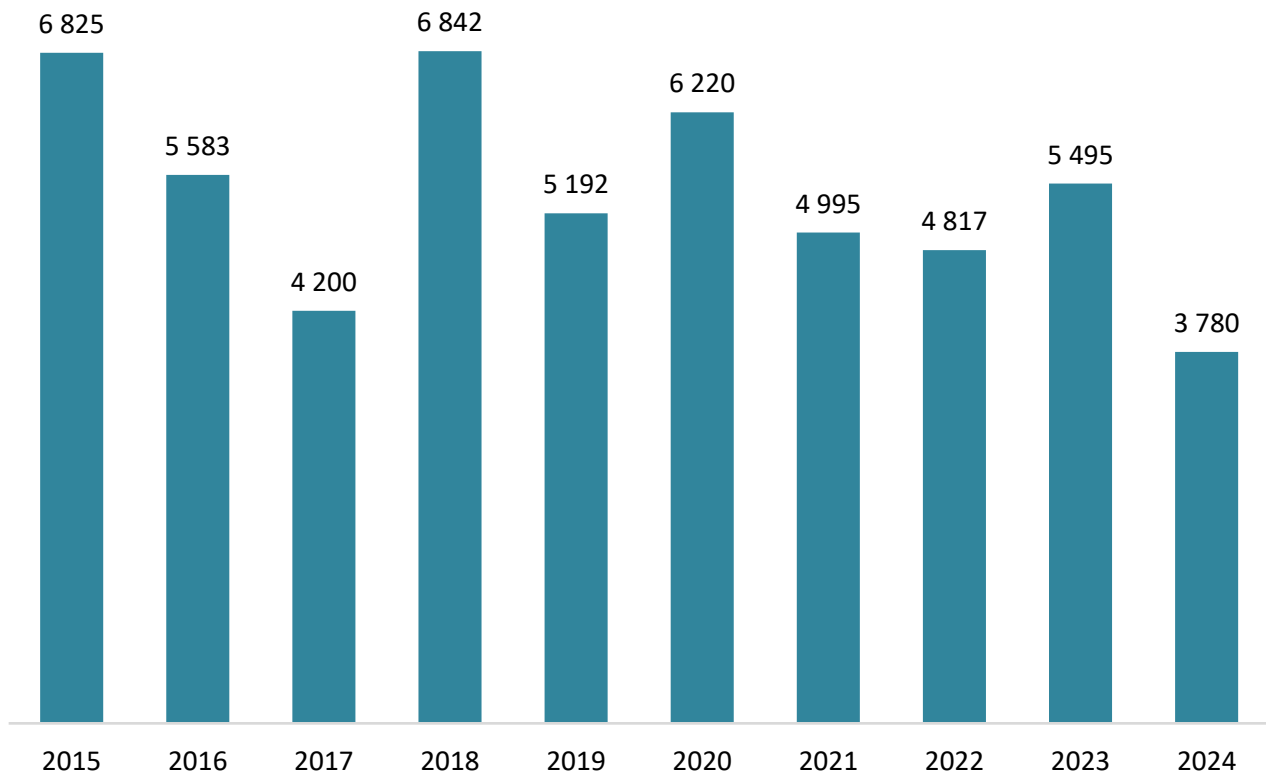


Chart 12 Evolution of the friendly settlements and unilateral declarations over the past ten years

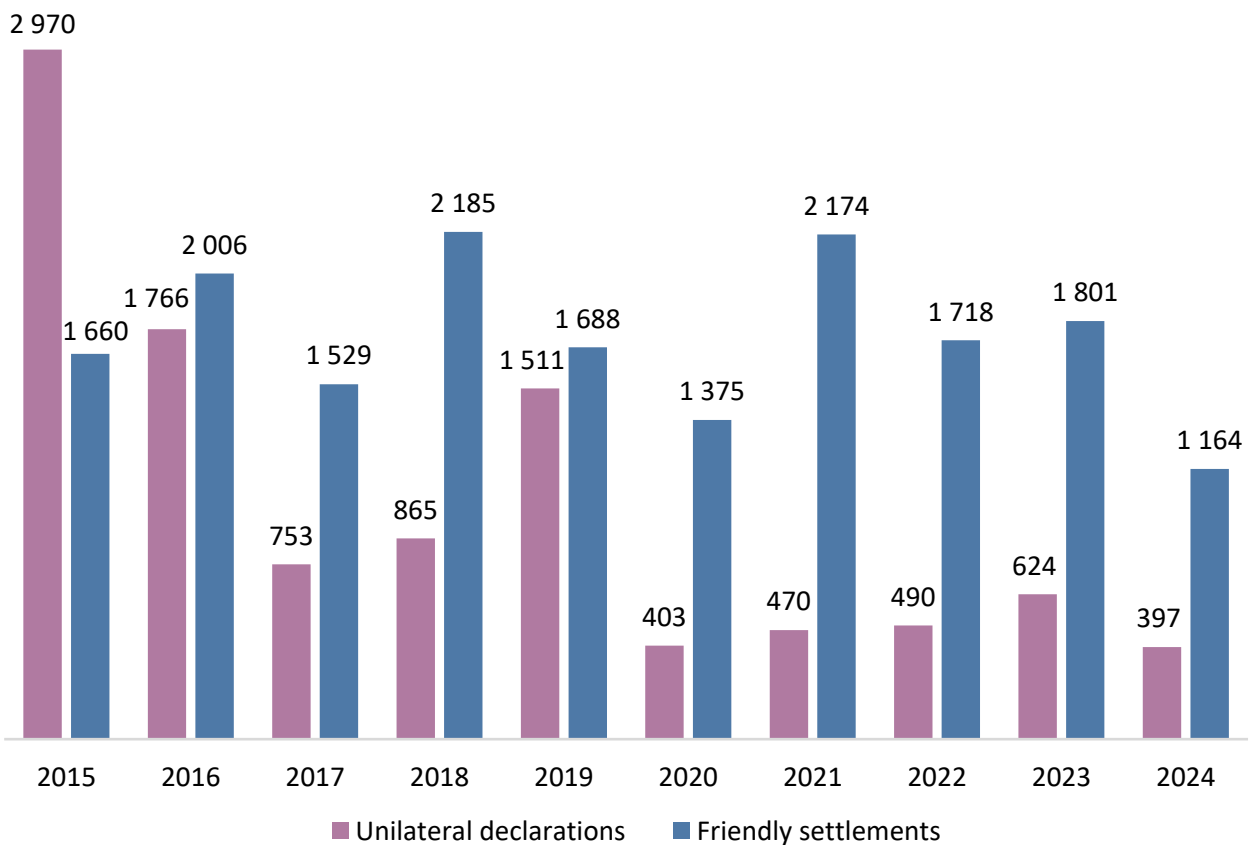
